BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

Within the context of the Mission of TAMCC, the aim of the Baccalaureate Program in Educational Administration is to prepare students to successfully contribute to the administering of schools. This aim will be achieved by providing students with knowledge, skills and experiences needed to meet the challenges of managerial and administrative issues in schools. The Program is embedded in the context of the realities of education in the region.

The Program requires a minimum of 120 credits. Students who have achieved the University of the West Indies Teacher Training Certificate will be awarded a transfer of 30 credits (advanced standing). They will also receive advanced standing for the General Education courses, which they have successfully completed and passed with a minimum grade of C.
