Sports

Sports is an integral part of the overall educational process in the College's program. There are many reasons:

What is the Mansion System?

The mansion system has been developed to allow all staff and students throughout the college to participate in track and field based on age categories. It is also used to encourage all staff and students to interact and socialize in sports. The mansions are named after persons who would have given invaluable service to the college. Francis Mansion (Maroon) named after Mrs. Bernadette Francis; Friday Mansion (Orange)—Dr. Wellington Friday; Pitt Mansion (Bone Brown)—Dr. De Vere Pitt; Radix Mansion (Purple)—Mr. Alban Radix. Mansion meetings will be announced and a list of students and their respective mansion will be available at the Dept. of Student Affairs.

How are students placed in mansions?

Students are placed in mansions through random selection by the records office during registration.

Can students switch mansion?

No. The student remains in that mansion throughout their college time. If a student graduates and return to college, the student is likely to be placed in another mansion.

What activities are played at the college?

The College has intramural competitions in soccer, netball, cricket, basketball, volleyball, table tennis, and swimming.

The annual athletic sports meet is usually before Intercol and takes place at the Tanteen playing field. It includes all field events male and female open, cross country male and female open, and road relay prior to the day of sports. The running/track events will be held on sports day.

Who can compete?

All staff and registered students can participate in any activity at the College.

What are the procedures?

For sporting competitions, students are asked to form teams and submit the teams at the Dept. of Student Affairs before the deadline posted. In light of wanting to learn a particular sport i.e. cricket, football, table tennis and basketball, students are asked to sign up at the Dept. of Student Affairs for the activity.



Is the College affiliated to any national organizations?

The College holds membership in the Grenada Netball Association, the Grenada Football Association, the Grenada Athletic Association, Grenada

Cricket Association and the Grenada Volleyball Association. The College also participates in competitions organized by these associations. The College participates in invitational games at other tertiary institutions in the O.E.C.S.

How can I represent the College?

Students can represent the College by participating in the intramural competitions,

In the case of participating for the College overseas, a consent letter must be signed by the parents of the athlete giving permission for the athlete to travel. The College usually takes care of the traveling expenses (air tickets, accommodation, meals etc.)

Any registered student, faculty or staff can represent the College unless its age stipulated.
