Financial Aid & Scholarship FAQ's

Department of Student Affairs



Q: Do I have to apply for the Scholarship?

A: Yes. Application forms need to be downloaded from the Colleges website at www.tamcc.edu.gd, completed and submitted to the Department of Student Affairs by July 31 of each year.

Q: What happens if I do not meet the deadline?

A: Processing of your application will be delayed or denied.

Q: Is the information provided by the applicant for Scholarship verified?

A: Yes. A thorough investigation is carried out to verify the information provided.

Q: What happens if inaccurate information is provided?

A: The applicant will be disqualified and will not be able to apply for any future aid. This also amounts to a breach of the College's Zero Tolerance Policy which can lead to suspension and or expulsion.

Q: How do I know if I am granted a Scholarship?

A: An officer from the Department of Student Affairs will contact you.

Q: Do I have to repay the Scholarship?

A: No.

Q: Where does the money comes from to support the Scholarship?

A: Activities of the Department of Student Affairs.

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Financial Aid FAQ's

Q: What is Financial Aid?

A: Monetary assistance provided to fulltime registered students to meet their college expense based on need.

Q: Who can apply for Financial Aid?

A: Any fulltime registered student of the College.

Q: What type of Financial Aid is available?

A: Aid is provided for tuition, transportation, books, meals and examinations.

Q: Can I apply for more than one type of Aid?

A: Yes, but there is no guarantee that more than one type will be provided.

Q: How much Aid can I receive?

A: The amount of aid provided depends on availability of funds and need of the applicant. Assistance ranges from 10% - 100%.

Q: Is Financial Aid guaranteed?

A: No. Assistance is based on availability of funds and verification of student need.

Q: Do I have to reapply for Financial Aid?

A: Yes. Application for Financial Aid should be done yearly since student circumstances may have change resulting in less or more aid.

Q: How do I apply for Financial Aid?

A: Application forms need to be downloaded from the College's website at

www.tamcc.edu.gd, completed and submitted to the Department of Student Affairs by September 30 of each year.

Q: What happens if I do not meet the deadline?

A: Processing of your application will be delayed or deferred to the following Academic year.

Q: Is the information provided by the applicant for Financial Aid verified?

A: Yes. A thorough investigation is carried out to verify the information provided.

Q: What happens if inaccurate information is provided?

A: The applicant will be disqualified and will not be able to apply for any future aid. This also amounts to a breach of the College's Zero Tolerance Policy which can lead to suspension and or expulsion.

Q: How do I know if I am granted Financial aid?

A: An officer from the Department of Student Affairs will contact you.

Q: Do I have to repay Financial Aid?

A: Only if the student withdraws from the College.

Q: Where does the money comes from to support Financial Aid?

A: Activities of the Department of Student Affairs, Business Sector, Trust Fund and Government of Grenada.

Q: I have more questions about financial aid. Where do I go?

A: The Department of Student Affairs or log on to www.tamcc.edu.gd and click the Department of Student Affairs link.

Scholarship FAQ's

Q: What is a Scholarship?

A: Monetary assistance provided to fulltime registered students to meet their college expense based on academic performance.

Q: Who can apply for a Scholarship?

A: Any fulltime registered student of the College with a Grade Point Average of 3.5 and above moving on to final year and participates (ed) in student life.

Q: What type of Scholarship is available?

A: Tuition, transportation, books, meals and examinations.

Q: Can I apply for more than one type of Scholarship?

A: No.

Q: What is the value of the Scholarship received?

A: The value of the Scholarship is equivalent to the final year tuition of the successful applicant.

Q: Is the Scholarship guaranteed?

A: Yes.

Q: How much Scholarship is offered per academic year?

A: Three scholarships are offered per academic year. One scholarship is offered per School. With regard to the School of Continuing Education, the Scholarship will go towards final year expenses.
